On behalf of the Board of Directors, I want to thank all of the members who have not only renewed their yearly membership but have also decided to increase their level of support. We are gratified by the many people who want to help the association grow to its full potential.

We also ask that you save the date of Wednesday, April 27 at 5:30pm for the Annual Meeting of the Association. For those who attended last year, you will recall it was the first opportunity to tour our new "home". It's hard to believe how far we have come in such a short period of time. Once again we will have a potluck dinner so bring your favorite food and enjoy the ambience of your Visual Arts Center.

The board has been involved since November in a strategic planning process and has reviewed all our major areas of operation, funding sources and community impact. As a result, we have some new activities planned, revamped others, and are growing those that have been especially successful. We appreciate your continued support and look forward to an exciting year ahead.

Important Proposed By-Law Change

The Board will be proposing an amendment to the Bylaws at the annual meeting prior to the election of board members. The proposed amendment will allow the Board to expand the number of board members up to a maximum of 24 (from its current limit of 17). The Board proposes having 18 members in the coming year and therefore, if the amendment passes, the Board will seek one additional board member to serve a one year term (to even out the staggered terms).

The 2011 nominating committee is Jennifer Broadus, Cesar Rodriguez, Don Myers and Kathy Stratton. Six current board members have expiring terms with three of the six willing to serve for another 3 years, if elected. We are seeking at least three additional candidates to serve 3 year terms with accounting, grant writing, festivals, fundraising as needed qualifications for Glynn Art's board.

John Ebersberger Workshop April 20-22

Glynn Art is presenting a workshop by acclaimed artist John Ebersberger on Wednesday April 20-Friday April 22 from 10am-4pm. This artist was published in the October 2010 issue of **American Artists Magazine** and features a demo by John to illustrate the Michael Gormely's article, "The Artists' Colony".

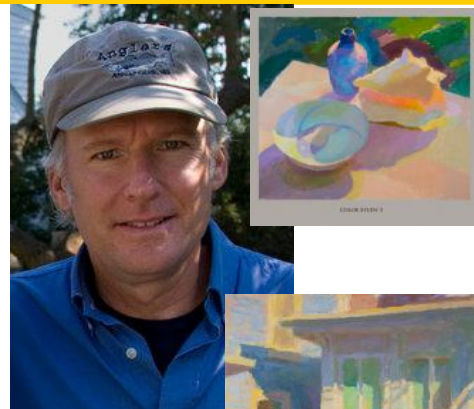


He has had articles in **The Artist's Magazine, American Artist, American Art Collector** and **Workshop Magazine**.

John's goal in his paintings is to express the full spectrum of nature's beauty. His paintings reflect the twin strains of Impressionism and Classical Realism. He earned a BFA from the Maryland Institute College of Art in 1977 and then studied under Cedric Egeli, the nationally known portrait painter.

It was Egeli who introduced John to Henry Hensche, the master impressionist who had served as Charles Hawthorne's teaching assistant in the 1920's in Provincetown, MA. Struck by the intensity of light Hensche was able to achieve in his canvases John studied with him every summer until his death in 1992.

Outreach Activities for Glynn Art
