An artist with an extensive background in city planning and design, Ms. Mueller's oil paintings focus on the rich architectural heritage of the Georgia Coast. Her work can be seen at the Glynn Art Association where she is currently teaching oil painting and at the Lighthouse Museum. She painted for Camalier and Buckley of Sea Island for twelve years, producing over 1000 oils paintings for them. She is the artist for the Byrd Cookie Company's Savannah Signature Series of cookie tins, distributed nationwide, and has also produced paintings for tins of Charleston and Hilton Head's Harbour Town.

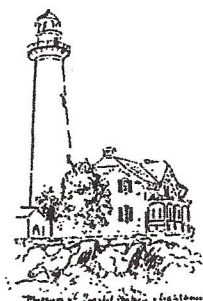
Ms. Mueller's other work includes set design for theatre and television ads, house portraits, and commission work. She designed the sets for the week long Milenium Celebration at the Cloister Hotel and Ocean Forest. Previously, she was co-author and illustrator of the "Embassy Fare" Cookbook, design consultant to the Episcopal Diocese of Washington, an instructor at the Catholic University's Graduate School of Architecture and Engineering, and a city planner for Fairfax County, Virginia.

A fine arts graduate of Goucher College in Maryland, Ms. Mueller did graduate studies at the University of Virginia and holds a Master's Degree in City Planning from the Catholic University Graduate School of Architecture and Engineering.

An active member of the community, she is on the Board of Trustees of Frederica Academy, President of the the Island Players Board and Artistic Director for the Glynn Art Association.
