This is a shot Ann took of a fountain in Forsyth Park in Savannah at night- Shot in manual with tripod, at F18 and 20 seconds shutter, 200 ISO with 55mm lens. No enhancements were made in Photoshop.



This is a shot Ann took of a fountain in Forsyth Park in Savannah in the daytime - Shot in aperture priority at F32, 1/60th shutter, 200 ISO with 75mm lens. Ann thinks she shouldn't have shot at 200 ISO on the day shots but didn't realize her camera was set on that. The results are fabulous nonetheless but she is always striving to learn more and improve. No enhancements were made in Photoshop.
